(a) DISPOSAL OF 0.1054 HECTARES OF LAND AT ROCKVIEW, PORTLAOISE

On the proposition of Councillor William Aird seconded by Councillor Kathleen O' Brien the Members unanimously agreed to the disposal of 0.1054 hectares of land at Rockview, Portlaoise in the townland of Ballydavis for a consideration of €300.00

(b) DISPOSAL OF 285M2 OF LAND ADJACENT TO NO. 13 CHURCHVIEW CLOSE, ARD EDMOND, CASTLETOWN
