#### SERVICED SITES FOR SELF BUILDERS

Laois County Council is actively considering the development of **serviced sites** over the coming years at a number of locations in the county.

In the first instance, eligibility will be determined by criteria as set out under the Croí Conaithe (Towns) Fund – Ready to Build Scheme (Serviced Sites for New Homes) Scheme. Under the scheme, local authorities are supported to make serviced sites in towns and villages available to potential individual purchasers. These sites will be available at a discount on the market value of the site for the building of a property for occupation as the principal private residence of the purchaser. The level of discount to the individual will depend on the level of servicing cost incurred by the local authority before the sale of the site with discounts up to a maximum of  $\[mathbb{e}\]$ 30,000. The amount of such discount will be reflected in the sale price of the site to the purchaser. The following locations are currently under consideration for serviced sites and/or have advertised sites for sale. Sites to be a minimum of 0.25 acres in size.

#### REGENERATION TEAM

Laois County Council has established a multi-disciplinary Regeneration Team, comprising staff from Housing, Planning sections and the Town Regeneration Officer, aimed at addressing vacancy and dereliction in the county.



This team aims to achieve targets set, by gathering data via:

- Geodirectory exercise (set out below)
- Continued engagement with property owners
- Engagement via derelict sites legislation where appropriate
- Action objectives of the Town Centre First Plan for Rathdowney and other town/village plans.

#### **Derelict Sites**

The Derelicts sites register is maintained by the Planning Staff. In conjunction with the TRO, the Derelict sites team are working on sites in both Rathdowney and Mountrath as indicated on the maps above.

#### **CPO** Activation

Notice of intention to CPO issued to landowners and also in the Leinster Express dated the 20<sup>th</sup> February for the following sites (Closing date for receipt of submissions – 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2023)

- 2 sites at Old Knockmay Road Portlaoise,
- 26 and 27 Triogue Manor, Portlaoise
- 15 Bracklone Street, Portarlington
- Main Street, Stradbally

The Derelict sites Team also works along side the Business Support Unit in advising in relation to the incentives available through the BSU and LEO office in relation to the reuse of derelict and vacant commercial properties.

## Vacancy Surveys

Arising from a Vacant Homes Team survey of properties identified as being vacant in data supplied by GeoDirectory (via a Dept of Housing 2022 initiative) has shown so far - of the 961 properties surveyed (residential and commercial), 584 properties were found to be vacant, with 39 of those also found to have some elements of dereliction. The Housing Section will endeavour to contact the owners of the vacant residential properties and outline the schemes available to return these properties to use for social housing. Where ownership cannot be established, local enquiries will continue in relation to ownership, vacancy history, etc. Where all other means of returning the properties to use have been exhausted, use of the CPO process to acquire properties deemed to be suitable for social housing may be considered.

Suitability for social housing will depend on the need and housing typology of need in particular locations. Queries regarding vacant properties should be emailed to <u>vacanthomes@laoiscoco.ie</u>

## Vacancy/Dereliction Activation Programme

Circular 14/2023 provided details on the launch of the Vacancy/Dereliction Activation Programme. A target of 60 vacant and derelict properties to enter the Programme and 16 CPOs / Compulsory Acquisitions to commence/complete in 2023 was set for Laois County Council. Targets for 2024 have not been issued to date.

Properties are counted as entering the Vacancy/Dereliction Activation Programme where they have been identified as being vacant or derelict as part of the vacancy survey and where efforts are being made to contact property owners. Properties approved/approved in principle for a Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant are also counted as entering the Programme. The Derelict Sites Team and the Vacant Homes Officer have cross referenced any common properties from both register and survey in an effort to determine the number of properties activated for the purpose of potential CPO.

## Vacancy / Regeneration Funding Schemes

A Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant is available for up to a maximum of €50,000, including VAT, for refurbishment of vacant properties for <u>use as a principle private residence or to be made available for rent</u>, including the conversion of a property which has not been used as residential heretofore. A top-up grant of up to €20,000 is also available for properties which are derelict. To qualify for the Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant, properties must be:

- Vacant for over 2 years
- Built before 2008

## COUNTY DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The 2 year report on the Implementation of the objectives of the Laois County Development is currently under preparation and will be circulated to the Council for the March Council meeting.

#### **Draft Local Area Plans**

## Draft Graiguecullen / Carlow Joint Urban Area Plan (JULAP)

The Draft Plan and various associated appendices including SEA, AA, SFRA and LTP were on display display for a 6-week period through 5th February 2024. Two public information sessions were held in relation to same. 72 no. submissions were recieved and preparation of the Chief Executives Report is now underway.

## **Draft Portlaoise Local Area Plan**

The Draft Plan and associated appendices has been finalized and will go on public display for a 6-week period from early March 2024.

## Draft Portarlington Joint Local Area Plan

ended on 19th October 2023. A total of 38 submissions were made. A Chief Executives report in respect of the 28 submissions made to Laois County Council has been completed. Writing of the draft Plan is now commencing.

Draft Mountmellick Local Area Plan took place over a 4-week period through 5th February 2024. An Issues Paper was prepared and a public information session was held on January 23rd 2024. 11 no. submissions were made at pre-draft stage. A CE report is now being prepared on the submissions received and will be circulated to the MD members for their noting.

#### Residential Zoned Land Tax

The draft RZLT in-scope maps for **calendar year 2024** were prepared and issued to the Dept. by deadline date of 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024. No submissions have been received to date.

The initiative of the Local Enterprise Offices nationwide, supported by Enterprise Ireland and the local authorities, takes place from the 4th to 8th March.

While there are hundreds of events taking place nationally during the week, including two National Spotlight events that are available for free online, there are also plenty of events in Laois open to all to attend, the majority of which are in person, with great presenters and great networking opportunities.

This year's programme of events includes "Be Brave – Take Your Business to the Next Level", a unique opportunity to glean insights from Pearse Flannery, author of the no.1 bestseller business book 'Grabbing your Oyster', in Preston House, Abbeyleix on Wednesday 6th March at 7 pm.

A Women in Business Networking lunch will take in Durrow Castle on Friday 8th March to celebrate International Women's Day.

## Safe Routes to School Programme

## Scoil Mhuire, Ballyroan Road, Abbeyleix

Following the completion of a Road Safety Impact Assessment in 2022 for the Ballyroan Rd, Abbeyleix, specialists were appointed to carry out a more detailed survey, and prepare preliminary designs and options report to deal with safety issues identified in the RSIA. High vehicular speeds and poor VRU infrastructure were the main issues identified. In line with this, an allocation was provided for Scoil Mhuire under the SRTS programme to deliver on a variety of interventions to improve the route for school pupils and free up pedestrian space at the front of school environment.


Following An Taisce's liaison with the school and LCC a delivery plan was issued, which contained a variety of recommendations focused on active travel.

In conjunction with An Taisce and the NTA, LCC prepared a design, which when approved saw the following interventions delivered:

- School Zone outside Scoil Mhuire, comprising pencil bollards and coloured line marking
- 2 new raised zebra crossings either side of the school
- junction tightening works at 3 estates
- side road junction improvements
- · raised table and speed ramps

Average speeds in the area were reduced by **between 21% and 31%** with significant reductions also seen in the highest speeds recorded, the resultant scheme has given school pupils, parents and residents a safer environment to walk and cycle. The success of the scheme has been highlighted on the National Safe Routes to Schools newsletter for February 2024.

The graphic on the following page highlights the positive difference the scheme has made.

The completed scheme has been well received and consists of:

- 3 New Zebra Crossings
- 1 speed ramp
- Junction tightening works at 3 housing estate entrances
- Creation of a School Safety Zone by the installation of pencil bollards and bespoke road markings
- Raised uncontrolled crossings at minor road junctions

## 4. Waste Management & Enforcement:

The Environment Section continues with its duties and responsibilities regarding facility authorisation, waste management and enforcement, producer responsibility, national waste priorities and the RMCEI environmental inspections.

#### 5. Environmental Protection

## a) Protect the Water Quality Status in all Water Bodies

- On site investigations of complaints in relation to water quality/water pollution are being carried out by Environmental staff.
- On-site investigations of complaints in relation to water pollution.
- On-going assessment of planning applications with regards to water quality protection.

#### b) Air & Noise:

- All noise and air complaints are being investigated.
- On-going assessment of planning applications with regards to air and noise protection.

## 6. New Grant Schemes, Regulations & Deposit Return Schemes

- Domestic Wastewater Treatment System Grants
  - Commencement Date 01st January 2024.
  - > 3 Property Owners were inspected in January 2024. All 3 will be eligible for the grant.
  - 10 Property Owners have expressed an interest in an inspection. Next inspections will take place in March following submission of RMCEI Plan.
  - 2 callers have been informed they would not qualify for the grant (i.e. GAA Club and a property owner who wanted to move septic tank due to a boundary issue

Following a workshop on the above grant schemes the Department advised that they will issue an advice note with a list of frequently asked questions to all Local Authorities.

#### 7. Rural Water - Multi Annual Programme 2024 to 2026

The Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage have issued a circular to Councils regarding the Multi Annual Rural Water Programme (MARWP) 2024 to 2026 inviting the council to make applications for funding.

The majority of measures in the MARWP are aimed at supporting Group Water Schemes. There are 9 individual funding measures available:

- Source Protection for existing private Group Water Schemes
- Water Treatment Provision, Improvements and Capital Replacement (existing private Group Water Schemes)
- Amalgamation and/or Rationalisation (existing private Group Water Scheme)
- Improvement of Infrastructure including Water Conservation (existing private Group Water Schemes)
- Extensions to existing Group Water Schemes and the Development of new Standalone Group Water Schemes

- Taking in charge of Group Water Schemes and Group Sewerage Schemes
- Community Water Connections and Community Wastewater Connections
- Innovative Demonstration Projects
- Wastewater collection and treatment needs for villages and settlements without access to public wastewater services
- The deadline for submission of applications for funding to the Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage is the 12<sup>th</sup> April 2024.

The Multi Annual Programme 2024 – 2026 has been advertised on the Council website, Social Media and in the Leinster Express and Laois Nationalist papers inviting applications for funding under the various funding measures available under the scheme.

The Rural Water Monitoring Committee met in February to discuss the new programme and support groups applying for funding.

Contact has been made with all Group Water Schemes in Laois to inform them of the scheme and to encourage submission of funding applications.

A no of expressions of interest have already been received.

The Council will make its submission to the Dept for funding for the new programme by April 12th 2024.

## National Waste Management Plan for a Circular Economy

The making of a Waste Management Plan is an Executive Function, under Section 22 of the Waste Management Act 1996.

The process for the development of a new, National Waste Management Plan for a Circular Economy has been underway since late 2021. The process has been coordinated by the Regional Waste Management Planning Offices. Currently, there are three Regional Waste Management Plans (Connaught, Ulster, Southern & Eastern Midlands), with designated Lead Authorities and, associated, Regional Waste Management Planning Offices RWMPO's.

Local Authorities are required to evaluate existing plans after 5 years. Existing Plans were evaluated in 2021 and the evaluation recommended that a single national waste management plan be prepared collectively by all Authorities. Taking account of national waste policy, the new plan was titled the National Waste Management Plan for a Circular Economy.

On 21st February, 2024, the Chief Executive made an Order giving statutory effect to the National Waste Management Plan for a Circular Economy 2024-2030.

## **Emergency Planning, Fire Services & Flood Relief**

# Retained Fire Services in Ireland - A Review of Recruitment and Retention and the Future Sustainability of Service Delivery

For information, as of 16<sup>th</sup> February 2024, there are 33 permanent vacancies in the Laois retained fire service. This is based on the new compliment of 100 retained firefighters (up from 75) in the 8 fire stations, following the WRC Agreement. 22 prospective new staff are currently at various stages of the recruitment process. Recruitment is ongoing to recruit more fire-fighters.

#### New Fire Station in Stradbally

Following approval of Part 8 proposals, Laois County Council has recently received 'NDFEM approval in principle, for the construction of a new Fire Station at Stradbally.' Laois County Council has appointed NODE Architecture as the lead consultant. The contract was signed on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> February 2024.

#### Mountmellick Fire Station upgrade

Part VIII documents have been completed by Tobin Consulting Engineers and presented to the Borris-in-Ossory – Mountmellick Municipal District Committee. Part VIII public consultation will commence on 1st March, 2024.

#### CORPORATE, COMMUNITY, CLIMATE ACTION, CULTURE, LIBRARIES & TOURISM

#### Local Enhancement Programme 2023-2024

Laois received an allocation €153,591.05 under the Local Enhancement Programme 2023. This total amount comprises:

- €127,922.54 Capital funding for use towards carrying out necessary repairs and improvements to facilities, energy efficiency type projects, purchase of equipment etc for communities.
- €25,598.51 capital funding ring-fenced for Women's Groups

The fund will be administered by Laois LCDC. Community groups can now make applications online. ## World of Work Programme 2023 – 2024

This programme has commenced with 2<sup>nd</sup> year students in Portlaoise College. In February, an introduction session on the functions of Laois County Council was delivered. Other sessions will follow.

Social Inclusion Community Activation Programme 2024-2028

The Contract for the new SICAP programme 2024-2028 was signed on the 20<sup>th</sup> December 2023 with Laois Partnership Company being appointed as the Implementing Partner for the new programme effective from the 1st January 2024. The 2024 general SICAP Annual Budget was confirmed in the amount of €763,980 with an additional €143,123 being allocated to New Arrivals. The 2023 Annual Performance Review was completed with the Annual Progress Report and the Review expected to be approved by the LCDC at the February Meeting.

## Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) 2023-2028

The Laois LECP framework document is being prepared and it is envisaged that the document will come before the March Council meeting for LA approval.

## Age Friendly Laois

Age Friendly Laois and Healthy Laois are preparing for the return of the *Live Well* Expo in Portlaoise College on Thursday 4th April, from 1pm to 6pm. In excess of 60 stands have been confirmed so far, and Speakers are being engaged for the day. Laois' Age Friendly Ambassador, Mrs Anna May McHugh will officially launch the Expo again this year. Approximately 1000 attended this event in 2023 and similar numbers are expected this year. The new Laois Age friendly guide to services in Laois has been distributed to all Libraries. These are available on request and to download via Laois.ie Age Friendly page.

#### Healthy Ireland

#### Smarter Travel Workplace Staff Survey.

Healthy Ireland and the Climate Action team are collaborating on a Smarter Travel Workplace Survey with the National Transport Authority. The main aim is to promote and support active and sustainable commuting for employees. This survey will assist in establishing staff opinion on travelling to work. This is a first step and will provide a Model to be expanded to other workplaces in Laois.

## Community Climate Action Fund

Applications for the Community Climate Action Fund close on the 11th March, 2024.

To support Laois communities in submitting their application for funding towards the development of their holistic project, an online webinar was held on Tuesday evening,  $20^{th}$  February. The event attracted over 40 registrations and the groups in attendance, received valuable insights and inspiration for potential community climate action projects (event was recorded and will be hosted on laois.ie). The interest in this event demonstrates the importance Laois communities place on addressing the challenges of climate change at the grassroots level, in their localities.



Systems Innovation for Sustainable Enterprise and Communities Course



In February, the Systems Innovation for Sustainable Enterprise and Communities (SISEC) course undertook a visit to Portlaoise Prison and convened a half day inperson training facilitated by IKC3 - Ireland's Knowledge Centre for Carbon, Climate, and Community Action, in collaboration with Laois County Council. This innovative endeavour aims to develop a pilot community-based education programme. During the visit, insights were gathered from 45 local participants representing diverse sectors and educational backgrounds. Together, they navigated through immersive learning phases, constructing a portfolio of projects aimed at assisting Laois County Council in their critical task of decarbonising the Portlaoise Town. As this dynamic collaboration unfolds, each participant plays a vital role in the pursuit of sustainable change, contributing innovative solutions to propel the community towards a greener, more resilient future. With each stride, progress is made towards achieving a collective vision of a thriving, low-carbon society, driven by knowledge, unity and a shared purpose.
