

A total of 31 applications have been received to date under the Repair & Leasing Scheme of which 4 are currently under consideration. 12 vacant properties have been acquired by CPO and 8 properties are currently going through the CPO process.

Refugee Resettlement Programme

There is currently I family remaining to be housed under our Refugee Resettlement Programme. It is anticipated that this tenanting will now be able to take place in July and this will see us completing our overall Refugee Resettlement Programme to house 22 families.

Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan

Since 1st February 2018, 111 Rebuilding Ireland Home Loans have been approved. 96 applications have been declined. Some of the reasons for negative outcomes include:

- Don't have the deposit required
- Repayment on the mortgage would exceed 30/35% of their income
- Already sufficiently committed (i.e. already are at capacity with other loans)
- Credit rating issues

HAP

A full review of all active HAP tenancies has been carried out over the last number of weeks. There are currently 956 active HAP tenancies, 307 of which have transferred from rent supplement.

Private House Grants

To the 13th July, 2021 the following grants for privately owned houses were approved:

- 81 Housing Aid for Older People Grant Applications approved in the sum of €347,038
- 56 Mobility Aids Grants approved in the sum of €228,170
- 40 Housing Adaptation Grants approved in the sum of €304,790

Private Rented Inspections

Due to Covid-19 restrictions in place inspections have been carried out virtually until the 14th July 2021 when they recommenced as in person.

Midlands Housing Retrofit Programme:

Budget approval has been granted 160 homes as part of a pilot initiative under the above programme.

The scope of eligible works includes:

- a) Attic Insulation
- b) Flat Roof Insulation
- c) External Wall Insulation / Dry Lining / Pumped Cavities
- d) Windows & Doors
- e) Heat Pumps
- f) LED Lighting

Houses must achieve a minimum BER rating of "B2" (or Cost Optimal Equivalent).

Letter of acceptance issued for Phase 1(62 units – Mountain View, Quigley Park and Radharc Alainn) with works to commence in shortly. Tenders have been received for Phase 2 and Phase 3 (98 units – Hillview, Derrymore and Kirwan Park).

Energy Efficiency/Retrofitting Programme:

Budget approval has been granted for the retrofitting of 31 homes in O'Moore Place, Portlaoise. Planned Maintenance works are also part of the planned programme. Tenders are due to be advertised in early Q3 2021.

LAOIS DRAFT COUNTY DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2021~2027

The CE report on the Submission to the Draft Plan was circulated to the Councillors on the 22nd June 2021. Under Section 12(6) of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended, Where, following the consideration of the draft development plan and the Chief Executive's report, it appears to the members of the authority that the draft should be accepted or amended, subject to subsection (7), they may, by resolution, accept or amend the draft and make the development plan accordingly.

The amendments only will be put on public display for a period of four (4) weeks and made available for the Public to view and make further submissions on if required.

MASTERPLAN UPDATES

Stradbally Road Masterplan Portlaoise

It is proposed to bring the draft masterplan for the Stradbally Road site (formerly Tyrrells Lands) to the Portlaoise Municipal District members for their consideration as part of the non-statutory process in the next fortnight.

Portarlington Regeneration Strategy

The Portarlington Regeneration Strategy has concluded its Public Consultation and a Chief Executives Report will be presented to the Portarlington Municipal District for their endorsement in July which will conclude this non statutory process.

HERITAGE OFFICER UPDATE REPORT

Just Transition Fund Project Conservation and Pollination

The design team for the Conservation and Pollination project was advertised and we are currently in the standstill period. All going well the conservation architect-led team will be announced early August. One site in each MD in Laois and Offaly will be involved, In Laois the sites are Kilmanman (Mountmellick MD), Dysartgallen (Portlaoise MD) and Clopook (Portarlington Graiguecullen MD). A networking meeting this week in Edenderry with Minister Eamon Ryan and Minister Pippa Hackett was attended by the Heritage Officer and Cathaoirleach.

Portlaoise Plane

The Portlaoise Plane, built and flown by the Aldritt and John Conroy in 1909, was brought home to Portlaoise this week. It is being stored in the Granary on Tower Hill and councilors will be issued with an invitation to view it before Heritage Week.

Know your Locality Laois

An online course on the heritage of Laois will be held in September, delivered by Irish Heritage School and funded through Creative Ireland. All are welcome and the booking details are at laois.ie/know-your-locality.

Conservation grants

All projects under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme, Historic Structures Fund and Community Monuments Fund are progressing well. Together the schemes will bring over €370,000 into Laois supporting jobs in traditional construction sector.

Heritage Week

Many of the Heritage Week events will take place online again this year, with some outdoor events being organised within Covid Guidelines. Details of all projects and events nationally are at www.heritageweek.ie and the week runs from 14th to 21st August.

BROADBAND

1. National Broadband Ireland (NBI)

A special meeting was held on Monday 10th May in which NBI presented to the Council giving an update on the Programme of works and rollout in the county.

Section 254 Licences have been applied for in the Eastern Municipal Area to provide pole network for rollout.

2. WIFI for EU.

A Tender in relation to the provision of WIFI infrastructure (equipment, installation and maintenance and support) in the following locations: Portlaoise, Portarlington, Abbeyleix, Mountmellick and Clonaslee.

It is anticipated that engagement with the successful tenderer will occur after 16th August at which time a timeline of works will be agreed.

Broadband Connection Points (BCP's)

Broadband connection Points are available to the public as outdoor facilities currently due to public health guidelines at

- Vicarstown Community Centre
- Oisin House Rossmore Killeshin
- Emo "Old School" Community Centre
- Donaghmore Workhouse and Agriculture Museum.

There is a 5th BCP applied for:

• Shanganamore Community Centre Barrowhouse – PENDING.

Local Enterprise & Economic Development

There continues to be a steady demand for LEO supports as follows:

- €262,926 approved in grant aid to 13 Laois businesses
- 765 owners/managers/employees participated on LEO training programmes
- 130 potential entrepreneurs have participated on Start Your Own Business Courses todate
- 140 Laois businesses have availed of mentoring to-date in finance, marketing, exporting, HR & health & safety.
- 55 Trading Online Voucher approvals to the value of €119,614
- 8 Laois Companies currently taking part in a Green for Micro programme
- 27 Laois companies currently taking part in the Client Stimulus Programme

THE SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE SCHEME COVID (SBASC)

To-date 30 applications have been received. Payments have been made to 12 applicants. 5 applications have been rejected and 13 applications are currently being processed.

WAIVERS: Quarter 3

A further extension of the 2021 Rates Waiver has been approved by the Government. Details of that extension are expected shortly.

Roads, Transportation & Smarter Travel

Roadworks Scheme 2021

The Annual Road Works Scheme 2021 was for the Members' consideration at April 2021 Monthly Meeting. Work is well underway delivering the Road works Scheme across all three Municipal Districts.

River Maintenance 2021

Survey work and report preparation for river maintenance works in 2021 have been progressing. Works to the identified locations below will be commencing in the coming weeks subject to the necessary permissions. These works will be undertaken before the work in river window ends at the end of September.

 - Survey completed.
 - AA report submitted to LCC Planning Section for decision.
 - Works comprising of silt and vegetation removal above the waterline.
- Ballymanus Bridge
 - Application for Approval made to ABP under Section 177(AE) of the Planning & Development Act 2000 (as amended) for removal of vegetated sand and gravel deposits from the river at Ballymanus Bridge, outside Stradbally, Co Laois.
 - Decision awaited from An Bord Pleanála.

Local Improvement Scheme 2021 – additional Funding

Additional funding of €270,000 was announced by DRCD to allow additional LIS schemes to be progressed in 2021. This additional funding will result in an additional 6 schemes being progressed. LIS funding for 2021 has allowed the delivery of 13 schemes submitted between March 2007 and January 2018. The oldest scheme on hand awaiting delivery dates from February 2018. Notwithstanding, there remains in excess of 70 schemes on the list for delivery.

Community Involvement Scheme

DTTaS has confirmed that the CIS scheme will be continued in 2022 and 2023. Applications for these years will be submitted in September 2021.

TII HD 28 - work sites

TII has identified 6 sites, located on the N77 (2 sites) and the N80 (4 sites) for works under the HD 28 funding programme. HD 28 works are necessary to improve skid resistance at the identified locations. Funding allocation has not been confirmed to yet but is expected to be approx. €900,000.

DTTaS Specific Improvement Grant

DTTaS has approved the following Specific Improvement Grants following successful funding applications;

- Poormans Bridge;
 - o €340,000
 - o This bridge has been on LCC's bridge list for many years awaiting final consents from ABP for works. A Specific Improvement Grant was applied for due to the significant cost of works arising from the requirements for the delivery of the works in compliance with the environmental constraints that are present on the site.
- L-20132 Lackamore, Mountmellick
 - o €170,000
 - o The existing drainage network completely collapsed over the 2020/2021 winter. The water is no longer contained with the drainage system. Water is spilling onto the public road and flows down the cul-de-sac for a distance of c.300 metres. The road pavement has completely eroded down below the foundation layers making it difficult for the public to travel the road safely.

Environment & Environmental Protection

1. Kyletelesha Tipping Head and Civic Amenity Site, Portlaoise:

Normal services continue at the Kyletelesha Landfill & Civic Amenity Site.

(a) Transfer Station & Civic Amenity Site:

The management and operation of the facility is progressing satisfactorily. Landfill Aftercare Monitoring:

All waste licence monitoring is on-going and up to date.

(b) C&D Waste Material:

It is estimated that in approximately 14 months' time Cell 15 will have reached its permitted Waste Licence intake. A waste license review will be needed for the continued acceptance of C&D material after this date. A cost benefit analysis is currently being carried to see if it will be financially worthwhile for a waste license review. This review is on-going.

2. Portarlington Civic Amenity Site:

This facility is operated and managed under contract with AES (Ireland) Ltd.

3. Historic Unregulated Waste Disposal Sites:

The tender evaluation is completed and the award of the contract is imminent. The Department Grant must be drawn down by early December 2021.

The historic unregulated sites being assessed are Aghanure, Killabban and the Rathdowney Road, Durrow

4. Bring Banks:

There are 42 Bring Bank sites provided in the county A total of 1062.87 tonnes of recyclable material is recorded to 15th July 2021.

5. Waste Enforcement & Litter:

- 2021 685 complaints logged for investigation to 21st June 2021.
- 2021 66 fixed penalty notices issued to date, for breaches of Litter Pollution Act, 1997
- Notices One Section 9 (Litter Pollution Act) and four Section 55 Notices under the Waste Management Act have issued to date in 2021 regarding unauthorised litter or waste activities. Waste Enforcement Officers are working to resolve issues where possible, but all cases will be pursued through Courts as necessary.

6. Illegal Dumping:

Waste Enforcement continue to tackle illegal Dumping in various problematic areas within the County in accordance with the current legislation. Enforcement efforts are limited by virtue of the current prohibition on the use of CCTV.

Over the Summer months Laois County Council is running two active campaigns across all our social media platforms (Laois.ie, Facebook and Twitter).

The first one is in conjunction with **WEEE Ireland** to highlight the proper and <u>FREE</u> all year round disposal of electrical items, batteries and light bulbs at our Recycling Centres at Kyleltalesha and Portarlington.

The second is run as part of the Leave No Trace Campaign with various messages to ask people to take their rubbish home, the danger of fires and to be respectful of the areas and people they visit in the current climate.

A programme of works for the above initiatives is currently being prepared by the Waste Enforcement Section.

8. Clean-Ups by Volunteers, Tidy Towns groups

Preparation work is currently underway for a planned Autumn Clean Up Blitz which will be run in conjunction with Laois Tidy Towns and funded under the Anti Dumping Initiatives.

9. Anti-Dog Fouling Campaign

70 mutt mitt bins have been installed around Laois, 50 permanent anti dog fouling signs are also being erected at present. The Environment Section held a photoshoot in Pairc on Phobail and an awareness campaign with children from a local school on Monday the 28th June. An active social media campaign will be run over the Summer months on our website, facebook and twitter pages. A billboard sign is also planned to raise awareness. We continue to work closely with the Tidy Towns Groups, Residents Association and our Green Dog Walker Campaign to promote responsible dog ownership.



10. Environmental Protection:

i) Protect the Water Quality Status in all Water Bodies:

On site investigations of complaints in relation to water pollution are being carried out by Environmental staff in compliance with Health and Safety and Covid-19 control measures.

- Investigation ongoing into surface water discharges to the lakes at Kilminchy.
- Investigation into elevated Phosphorus Levels in River Erkina downstream of Rathdowney WasteWater Treatment Plant
- Investigation into unauthorised wastewater discharges in the Triogue River at Kyletalesha, Portlaoise
- On-going assessment of planning applications with regards to water quality protection
- Regulation of Discharge Licensed Companies.
- Several Advisory Notices under the Water Pollution Acts 2007 & 2012 have been served relating to domestic wastewater treatment systems and continue to be enforced.

i) Air & Noise:

- In conjunction with the EPA, an NO₂ (Nitrogen Dioxide) monitoring survey will be carried out in the towns of Abbeyleix, Durrow and Cullahill to quantify prevailing air quality. Diffusion tubes were erected at 20 locations across the region on the 6th July and will be monitored for the next six months.
- A Section 26 Notice under the "Air Pollution Act, 1987" was issued on the 23rd June 2021 to a property in Portarlington, directing them to cease burning of all materials in a stove until it can be determined whether or not air pollution is being created.

Emergency Planning, Fire Services & Flood Relief

• In 2021 (to 12th July), Laois County Fire & Rescue Service attended 273 emergency incidents consisting of 135 fires, 89 special service incidents & 49 false alarms.

Fire Services Capital Programme

- An e-tenders procurement process for the appointment of designers for the Mountmellick Fire Station upgrade (€150,000 project consisting of a fire service drill tower and new concrete yard to the rear of the fire station).
- In recent months Elected Members were advised of an allocation of €140,000 for the acquisition of a new Water Tanker to support Fire Services operations in County Laois. The tanker chassis has been delivered to HPMP Fire, who are now in the process of building the body. Delivery is expected in Quarter 3 of 2021

Risk Based Management - Nearest Available Resource Project

• In accordance with the recently issued Circular Fire 01/2021, Laois County Council has established the Senior Project Group which has endorsed this project. The Working Technical Group has substantially completed its work. New townland data sets have been completed & uploaded it to the STORM mobilising system in ERCC & is being tested operationally in advance of full sign off of the project.

COVID-19 Report update

- Laois County Fire & Rescue Service continues to provide a full emergency service. In addition Covid 19 Contingency Planning is still a key focus for the Fire & Emergency Service.
- Laois Civil Defence provide key assistances, servicing requirements of the HSE, the Community Forum Call Centre and other local agencies.

CIVIL DEFENCE

• Efforts continue to identify a Portlaoise based facility to provide for the long term accommodation needs for Laois Civil Defence.

WATER SERVICES AND RURAL WATER

Public Water and Wastewater Capital

The following capital works have been approved by Irish Water:

- Ballyroan WwTP This is now complete. Process testing results show compliance with the licence requirements. We will be encouraging IW to proceed with storm tank and waste sludge storage tank as soon as possible.
- Durrow bring an additional production borewell into service in Fermoyle M + E works
 substantially complete, bringing of new borewell into supply ongoing. Price now
 received by Irish Water (IW) from Campions to install larger 6 inch pump with a 4
 inch motor and associated works at Fermoyle. Provision of a storage/blend tank and
 booster pump set also being discussed with IW.
- Coolbanagher On the 9th June, 2021 Irish Water approved a budget of €200,000 to bring an additional borehole into production at Coolbanagher. Laois County Council is now organising and overseeing the delivery of the required works which is expected to be complete in the first half of September, 2021.
- Disinfection/PH control programme; The Strand WTP boil water notice has been issued for this WTP, upgrade works as part of the Laois/Offaly disinfection programme are now complete with a 30-day process-proving period to be completed by the end of July/start of August 2021. New VSD recently installed for the borehole pump and sodium hypochlorite dilution is required on site to improve dosing control. EMR have also been on site as part of the telemetry upgrade programme in Co. Laois.
 - Design also progressing at present for Derryguile, Five-Wells, Kilminchy, Kyle, Lough, Derrymoyle, Knocks and Ballyroan WTPs.
- Castletown WwTP Inlet Works Storm and Sludge Program, new storm tank and sludge holding tank intended to be installed on site by the end of 2021. Replacement of fixed decanter with moving decanter is expected in the next two months. Order is placed and fabrication is underwary. Irish Water has recently applied to Laois County Council for planning to carry out the required upgrade works.
- Containerised unit program site survey works ongoing at Aughafeerish WTP. Piling required on site to support the concrete slab for the new container is due to commence on the 14/07/2021. UV containerised unit expected to be installed on site over the coming months.
- Leakage Reduction Programme Mains Rehabilitation works now complete in Portlaoise (Colliers Lane), Stradbally (Church Avenue), Abbeyleix (Tonduff) and O'Daly Terrace, Rathdowney. Find & Fix leak detection being carried out in Mountmellick and Portlaoise. ANB submitted by LCC to Irish Water for replacement of 150mm dia. asbestos watermain 900m long in the Swan supply due to ongoing watermain bursts in the area.

Well Grants – Applications continue to be processed. There were 81 applications received during 2020 of which 31 were paid. The remainder will be processed and progressed as relevant information is returned and works carried out. A further 15 no. applications have been received to date in 2021. All eligible claims to the Department for funding have been submitted and paid.

Laboratory

The Laboratory continues to be accredited to the international standard ISO 17025:2017. It is incrementally developing into a regional scale facility on a phased basis in alignment with the LA National Laboratory Strategy. The sample throughput in 2021 is projected to be 4, 500 compared with 3,800 in 2020. Under the LA National Laboratory Strategy, the Laboratory is designated to accommodate an estimated 9,000 samples in the short-term. Staff have shown great versatility and have been working a shift pattern (09:00 – 16:00 & 16:00 – 23:00) since May 2020 to foster social distancing within the Laboratory. There has been significant capital investment in instrumentation to improve testing capabilities and a new more efficient and secure laboratory information management system was installed in January (LabWorks).

Laois PPN in partnership with the HSE are offering LivingWorks START - online suicide prevention programme to help and support our communities in Laois. The programme outlines a four-step model to keep someone safe from suicide and includes impactful and interactive simulations.

Community Enhancement Programme 2021

On Friday 25th June the CEP subcommittee convened in order to appraise applications received under the 2021 scheme. A total of 95 applications were received seeking funding in the amount of €350,913.38. The subcommittee again noted that the programme as in previous years was very much oversubscribed with Laois being awarded funding to the value of €136,524. A total of 68 groups had their applications recommended which will go forward to the July LCDC for full approval.

Sustainable Energy Communities

Portlaoise 2040 SEC application for Energy MasterPlan (EMP) has been submitted. This has been drafted and is with the SEAI mentor awaiting approval. Portarlington SEC have completed their community charter and are in the process of completing their application for EMP with the SEAI mentor. Arrangements are underway to build up interest into other towns and villages.

Tidy Towns: Community Heritage Grant for Pilot Climate Change Baseline Study Laois Federation of Tidy Towns have received €11,326 in funding for a Pilot Laois Tidy Towns Built Heritage and Climate Change Baseline Study to work with 5 Tidy Towns groups. Laois Federation of Tidy Town were the named applicants and this funding covers 80% of the total project costs. The five pilot groups have been selected as Ballacolla, Spink, Stradbally, Portlaoise and Clonaslee.

In this study one feature of built and architectural heritage is identified by the Tidy Towns Committee to encapsulate what they see as a heritage feature that demonstrates the effects of climate change. Effectively they would be adopting one feature to monitor long term as a tangible indicator of Climate Change.

Stop Food Waste Campaign

Multimedia campaign featuring Catherine Fulvio on Summer BBQ Food Waste ran for 3 weeks over June and received 23.2k views on Laois County Council facebook page alone (it was led by LCC EAO and ran simultaneously across 14 Local Authorities) as well as a two week ad campaign on Midlands 103 with Westmeath County Council and news bulletin item and interview on i Radio as well as national coverage in the RTE Guide and RTE.ie.



Green GAA

Ratheniska GAA club are participating in national GAA Club pilot under the theme of waste. Environmental Awareness Officer visited club to carry out a Waste Audit and they are undertaking a campaign to eliminate single use plastic bottles

SPORT & LEISURE UPDATE

- Bike Week 2021 Funding of €12,400 has been received to deliver a full programme of events from 12th 18th September and which will overlap with European Mobility Week 16th 22nd September. Flagship event on Wed 15th September in partnership with Climate Action team, with plans for over 1000 Primary School children to cycle through Portlaoise, as a promotional tool for Cycle Bus. In total 20 events planned county wide.
- National Recreation Week and National Play Day Events delivered from 3rd -10th July county wide with over 200 children attending outdoor events deliver in compliance with COVID 19 guidelines
- Healthy Ireland Active Parks Programme: Currently being delivered at 6 locations weekly countywide

ARTS & CULTURE

In the Open | Faoin Spéir

An Arts Office collaborative application with the DAC to the Arts Council under the Faoin Speir Project Scheme has been successful and funding in the amount of €90,000 will be available to deliver a planned series of performance arts projects in 7 towns in the county over the next few months. Stradbally ~ Sept 19th Abbeyleix October 17th, Rathdowney ~ November 21st, Portarlington ~ December 12th, Mountmellick – February, Mountrath – March, Portlaoise – April. Work is progressing on the programme.

Poetrytown 10-18 September

Funded by Poetry Ireland and the Arts Council, Mountmellick is one of the twenty towns across the country that have been selected. Under this initiative a Poet laureate is commissioned to write a poem for the town. Local businesses and cafés will 'prescribe' poems to customers. Workshops and window displays will be arranged. The photo launch for the national Poetrytown campaign took place in Mountmellick during the week. The national campaign takes place in August when the Laureates and the programme will be revealed.

Laois Arthouse

The Laois Arthouse Gallery, Stradbally, Co Laois is delighted to re-open with an exhibition entitle Painting the Particular-Paintings of Suburban Dublin 2004-2016 by Mary Burke. Mary conducts this year's annual Adult Summer Art course in the Malthouse, located in the centre of Stradbally, Co Laois with 8 participants.

Creative Ireland Laois

'Fadó Faces' an outdoor drive-by art exhibition by ten local Laois artists celebrates the lives and stories of older people in Laois, through traditional portrait painting and digital art, and took place on July 18 at Laois Co. Council Plaza.

The launch of Laois County Library Service publication 'Open a Window on the Past: Helen Maybury Roe and Lucy Franks will take place as part of Heritage Week on Aug 14, at 2pm in BloomHQ, Mountrath, and a streamed live 'reading' event by author and Historian in Residence, Regina Dunne at the Old Fort Quarter, Portlaoise on Aug 20, at 7pm.

Local Live Public Performance Scheme LLPPS

Laois County Council has been awarded €143,000 under the governments Local Live Public Performance Scheme. The rollout of the programme commences this month with a focus of filming artists in heritage and tourist settings across the county. The Scheme aims to support the creation of employment opportunities for local professional artists and musicians of all performance genres, cinematographers, technicians, crew, staging, lighting, sound engineers and other support staff working in the live commercial arts and culture sectors in County Laois. Filming will take place and small audiences will be invited to attend the concluding event in each location, in compliance with prevailing Covid 19 restrictions at the time. Screenings of the recordings can be arranged at a later date with an invited audience.
