Call remains open for Expressions of Interest in respect of:

- a. Appropriately zoned land for housing development
- b. Advanced Turnkey Purchase arrangements for un-commenced residential developments

Expressions of Interest submitted for advanced purchase turnkey arrangements are currently being examined. Members are also advised that the Council's Housing Team has met local builders on a face to face basis to explore the potential of affordable and cost rental agreements.

REGENERATION / VACANT HOMES

A Vacant Homes/ Regeneration internal working group (comprised of SEO Housing, Vacant Homes Officer, Derelict Sites Technician, Planner and Chief Technican) has been established to map and examine vacancy and dereliction in a number of towns.

Vacancy Surveys

Initial surveys have been completed in Mountmellick and Mountrath. The information on the surveys has been mapped and further investigation on a number of identified properties to confirm their vacancy status is being carried out. When the vacancy status of the identified properties is established, the Working Group will assess the future potential use of such properties, in terms of housing or other use.

A plan for acquisition of properties, subject to available funding and/or use of the CPO process will then be determined for each area.

This will be dependent on

- (a) the number of viable properties for residential use,
- (b) the requirement for and level of social housing already in that locality and
- (c) the capacity of the local authority to carry out works to the property with funding provided for under the **Buy** and **Renew Scheme** criteria if dereliction is extensive or the property is difficult to renovate for housing purposes.

Owners will also be encouraged to use the **Repair and Leasing Scheme** to bring properties back into use.

Generally, across the County, Expressions of Interest were invited via advertisement and LCC website for vacant /derelict properties.

Target Retrofitting Programme for 2022

The target number of units determined for 2022 to retrofit to a B2/Cost Optimal standard in County Laois - Target of 39 residential units

The programme will allow for an average spend of €33,333 per property on eligible energy efficiency works with additional project management fees also available, the detail of which will issue under separate cover.

This will bring the overall average grant available per property to approximately €36k depending upon the number of properties being retrofitted in each local authority area.

A submission was made to the Dept of Housing on the 27th April for 47 units in the following estates.

- 1) Thornberry, Abbeyleix 16 units.
- 2) Church Avenue, Stradbally 9 units.
- 3) Slieve Bloom Park, Clonaslee 8 units.
- 4) St. John's Square, Portlaoise 7 units.
- 5) Old School Road, Ballylynan 7 units.

(NOTE: The above estates were prioritised based on property age and MD area.)

Confirmation of the exact funding and approved unit numbers has not been confirmed to date.

There will be a match funding requirement from the Council in the above regard, which will be determined when tender prices are returned.

PRIVATE RENTED INSPECTIONS

All private rented dwellings must comply with the Housing (Standards for Rented Houses) Regulations 2019 and the local authority has no discretion in this regard. This also includes those properties whose landlords are availing of the HAP scheme, who agree to an inspection of the property when they sign up for the scheme. Property owners not availing of the HAP scheme are also subject to inspection if they rent the property in a private arrangement.

The Council has issued 472 Notices of Works to date in 2022 in the form of a letter detailing the works that need to be carried out to bring the property up to the required standard. The Notice of Works also gives the property owner a timeframe in which the works must be carried out as recommended in the guidelines for private rental inspections issued by the Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage.

Queries from landlords relate mostly to technical aspects of the works required, with an understanding of the need to comply with the Regulations. If a property owner is anxious about aspects of an improvement letter issued, they can contact the local authority and be assured that a reasonable practical approach will be taken to give them the opportunity to address the issues raised. The Housing Inspections team can be contacted via email at propertyinspections@laoiscoco.ie

Notwithstanding the above and recognising the health and safety of the tenant as priority, should urgent works be required, the property owner is made aware of the consequences of non-compliance within a safe timeframe, i.e., fines and/or prosecution under the Regulations.

BROADBAND

1. National Broadband Ireland (NBI)

Section 254 Licences have been applied for in the Eastern Municipal Area to provide pole network for rollout. NBI are currently working on the Programme of works for rollout in the county. NBI are engaging with LCC in relation to above and in relation to hedge cutting.

NBI are rolling out fibre in the Portlaoise area at present.

The 1st connected premises in Laois is in Monevea, Crettyard and this site was launched on Friday 13th May.

2. WIFI 4 EU.

WiFi4EU is a project developed by the European Union that intends to bring free WiFi to local communities. The aim of WiFi4EU initiative is to bring high-quality WiFi access to places where it is not yet available but would provide value for the community and visitors to the County. The rollout of the provision of WIFI infrastructure in public places has commenced (equipment, installation and maintenance and support) in the following locations: Portlaoise, Portarlington, Abbeyleix, Mountmellick, Mountrath as follows:

- Fit out in Portlaoise is now complete on 12 building in the town to provide free public WIFI along the Main Street, Fitzmaurice Place, Lyster Square and the Plaza at Co. Hall. This will go live within the next few weeks.
- Fit out is currently under way in Portarlington and in various building along the Main Street and the Link Road.
- Fit out is currently under way in Abbeyleix and in various building along the Main Street.
- Fit out is currently underway in Mountmellick in the MDA Complex.
- Premises have been secured in Mountrath, Camross and Ballinakill.
- Survey and Consultation is under way with property owners in Mountmellick, Mountrath, The Swan with further proposals in Stradbally.

This project is being delivered by "Network and Infrastructure Support Ltd." On behalf of Laois County Council. The Broadband Officer is available for any queries in relation to this project.

3. Broadband Connection Points (BCP's)

As part of the roll out of the National Broadband Plan, Laois County Council launched Broadband Connection Points (BCPs) in 6 areas in rural Laois.

Local Enterprise & Economic Development

Local Enterprise Office (LEO): Summary of actions for May

The National Student Enterprise Awards took place on the 18th May at The Helix, Dublin.

Two students from Portlaoise College were amongst this year's National Final award winners. Oisin Grundy was the outright winner of the Creative Business Idea Video Competition at Junior Cycle Level and Mosa Hafeez took 2nd place at Intermediate Level in the My Entrepreneurial Journey Competition.

National Enterprise Awards 2022

Salutem Insights will represent Laois at the National Enterprise Awards to be held in the Mansion House on the 2nd June 2022. Salutem Insights create tailored solutions for a variety of complex pharma industry issues within the public and private marketplace.

Ministerial Visit

Minister of State for Business, Employment and Retail, Damien English, visited the Local Enterprise Office (LEO) on 12th May where he met with council members, officials, members of the LEO team as well as some of their client companies. The Minister presented Ger Slevin and Sandra Reddin of Salutem Insights with a plaque as Winners of the County Enterprise Awards.

The Minister visited called to the Portlaoise Enterprise Centre where he visited LEO client company TSI Flowmeters Ltd. He finished his Laois visit at another LEO client. A number of food producers from the Laois Taste Group also were in Ballykilcavan including The Merry Mill, Temptation Patisserie and Mueller and O'Connell Bakery.

Business Support Unit (BSU):

The BSU has processed 66 applications under the Town and Village Streetscape scheme 2021/2022.

Roads, Transportation & Smarter Travel

Roadworks Programme 2022;

The Annual Road Works Scheme 2022 was adopted by the Members at the March 2022 Monthly Meeting. Work has commenced to deliver the Road Works Scheme across the three Municipal Districts.

River Drainage Maintenance

Various, county-wide surveys are ongoing to inform and underpin river drainage maintenance works later in 2022.

As of mid-May 2022 there are two planning consents recently issued to Laois County Council from An Bord Pleanala and 11 Appropriate Assessment Screening Reports under development for approval by LCC Planning Department. Additionally, a further 7 Appropriate Assessment Screening Reports give rise to a requirement for planning applications to An Bord Pleanala. In the case of those 7 Assessments, works are unlikely to be possible in 2022, pending assessment by An Bord Pleanala.

Price Escalations for Road Making Materials:

Rising inflation is influencing upwards the price of materials used in the roadworks programme. Having received tender submissions for multiple roadworks programme projects, it is apparent that there are significant cost increases for the supply of bitumen and other road surfacing materials. The cost of bitumen in 2022 is approximately 30-33% more expensive per tonne and the cost of road surfacing materials for overlay project is on average 13-16% more expensive in 2022 than it was in 2021.

The knock-on effect of these price rises is that, based on funding available in 2022 v 2021, there will be a reduction in the outturn of Restoration Improvement (overlay) works of 10-15% in 2022 -v- 2021 and a reduction Restoration Maintenance (surface dressing) works of 15-20%. Similar reductions apply to other areas of the Roadworks Programme.

Local Improvement Scheme 2021

Funding in the sum of €270,000.00 has been announced by DRCD.

In line with allocated funding under the Scheme in 2022, there will be 9 no. schemes progressed (4 in the Eastern MD, 2 in the Central MD and 3 in the Western MD). Assuming offers are accepted, local contributions paid and other LIS issues appropriately addressed, these Schemes will progress in 2022.

The available funds have been allocated in line with the terms agreed with Elected Members in Q4 2021 i.e. funding proportionately allocated across MDs, in line with number of Schemes to hand per MD, and in date order.

Further funds may be made available to those local authorities who realise early delivery of the initial priority list to a value of €270,000. This council will be progressing our current priority schemes as a matter of urgency with a view to obtaining further funding to allow us to progress additional schemes in 2022, should additional funding become available.

Environment & Environmental Protection

Kyletalesha Landfill, Transfer Station and Civic Amenity Site, Portlaoise:
 Normal services continue at the Kyletelesha Landfill Facility and Civic Amenity Site.

The new SCADA telemetry monitoring system is now installed and operating at the landfill.

Landfill monitoring and aftercare maintenance is on-going.

The Council has received €82,000 funding. The approved projects are:

- The provision of audio devices at illegal dumping black spot areas
- Mattress Amnesty 3 locations

4. Illegal Dumping:

Waste Enforcement continue to tackle illegal dumping in various problematic areas within the County in accordance with current legislation. Enforcement efforts are limited by virtue of the current prohibition on the use of CCTV etc. Tonnes of material collected to date not yet available.

5. Environmental Protection

a) Protect the Water Quality Status in all Water Bodies

On site investigations of complaints in relation to water quality/water pollution are being carried out by Environmental staff.

- Investigation ongoing into wastewater discharges to the lakes at Kilminchy.
- On-going assessment of planning applications with regards to water quality protection.
- On-site investigations of complaints in relation to water pollution.

b) Air & Noise:

Laois County Council is awaiting the final report from the EPA on the N77 Nitrogen Dioxide monitoring survey carried out at Abbeyleix, Durrow and Cullahill. All noise and air complaints are being investigated.

Emergency Planning, Fire Services & Flood Relief

In 2022 (to date) Laois County Fire & Rescue Service attended 204 emergency incidents consisting of 68 fires, 107 special service incidents & 29 false alarms.

Fire Services Capital Programme

- The Part VIII planning process for a new fire station for Stradbally was approved by Laois County Council at its January 2022 meeting. Correspondence has now been sent to the NDFEM advising them of same & requesting approval to go to tender for a design team to progress the project. An acknowledgement of this request has been received from the NDFEM.
- The upgrade to Mountmellick Fire Station is now at design stage. This work
 consists of new drill tower, concrete yard & hydrant connection. Tobin
 Consulting Engineers have been awarded the design contract. The site survey
 has been completed & the preparation of the documents to progress this
 project has now commenced.

WATER SERVICES AND RURAL WATER

Portlaoise Water Supply Improvement Scheme - Irish Water now progressing with developing well PWo7 and well PWo8. A draft planned maintenance programme has been submitted to IW and agreed, with funding available under Capital Maintenance.

Disinfection/PH control programme – Civil works progressing in Derryguile, Kyle, Five Wells, Derrymoyle and Lough WTPs. MEICA works progressed at Knocks, Derryguile, Lough, Kyle, Five Wells and Ballyroan WTP. Process proving now complete at the Knocks and Ballyroan WTPs. Kyle WTP currently in process proving. ESB supply upgrade currently being progressed for Five Wells and Lough WTPs.

Lead Mitigation Strategy – Derryguile WTP has been identified as a priority plant under the IW Lead Mitigation Strategy for addition of Orthophosphate Treatment.

Networks and Water Conservation - First fix, find and fix and lead replacement works continue throughout the county. Significant progress in Portarlington in the area of leakage management. Replacement of watermain in the Swan network is ongoing.

Taking in Charge

Continue working with IW to take the 17 no. outstanding legacy estates in charge by IW - already taken in charge by LCC. 10 no. estates have been progressed and referred to the Planning Section and work is ongoing on the remaining 7 no. estates.

Multi Annual Rural Water Programme.

Projects under the current programme, 2019 – 2021, are being completed and claims paid and recouped. The Department has advised that details of the next Rural Water Programme will be issued during Q3. An Advance Measure, A8 – Waste Water Collection and Treatment Needs for Villages and Settlements without access to Public Waste Water Services is currently being assessed with a view to an application from Laois County Council.

Well Grants – 22 no. applications have been received in 2022 and all are being progressed.

HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE TO REFUGEES FLEEING CONFLICT

Laois County Council continues to assist IPAS with the temporary accommodation of a number of persons who have arrived into Ireland over the past number of weeks. Currently there are 269 persons that have been accommodated through LCC and IPAS in hotels, guesthouses and hostel accommodation. Many others have also come into the county by their own means, some residing with families and others accommodated by the various parishes. There are currently 487 displaced Ukrainian citizens in County Laois.

The Local Authority has also provided, upon request, lists in relation to:-

- Vacant buildings and;
- Site suitable for medium to long term solutions

Private accommodation via Red Cross and other pledges has to date accommodated 21persons (7 households).

Laois Ukrainian Community Response Forum

Laois County Council established a "Ukrainian Crisis Multi Agency Response Forum" along the lines of and largely similar to the Covid-19 Community Response Forum of the past two years.

The forum convened its most recent fortnightly meeting on Wednesday 18th May 2022 at which a number of tasks and local actions were agreed.

All efforts currently are being supported by An Garda Síochána, Dept of Social Protection, the HSE, the St. Vincent de Paul, Civil Defence, the Local Development Company, various local voluntary groups, local communities and Housing personnel at this point.

To date the forum convened on 5 occasions. Next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday 8^{th} June. At present the forum consists of 44 members representing 23 members groups/agencies.

Corporate, Community, Climate Action, Arts, Culture, Libraries & Tourism

CORPORATE

Civic Receptions in honour of Mr. Gary O'Reilly and Ms. Nicole Turner in recognition of their success at the Paralympics Games, in Toyoko were held on the 28th April and 12th May 2022 respectively.

COMMUNITY

Syrian Resettlement Programme.

Thursday 12th May marked a closing event for the Syrian Resettlement Programme in Laois, with a gathering of the families and all partner agencies at Bloom HQ Mountrath. While the programme itself officially ended on the 18th Dec the gathering was unable to take place due to COVID-19. During the course of the programme 106 people comprised of 22 families were resettled in Portlaoise, Portarlington and Mountmellick.

Healthy Ireland

Minister Frank Feighan, Minister of State for Public Health, Well Being and National Drugs Strategy visited a number of Healthy Ireland funded initiatives in Laois on Tuesday, 3rd May, to view health partnership programmes and health and wellbeing initiatives being undertaken by Healthy Ireland Laois in the County. Further correspondence in relation to Healthy Ireland – Round 4 Projects/Actions funding allocations is anticipated in the coming weeks.

2021 Community & Voluntary Awards

On the 5th May Laois County Council were delighted to celebrate an in person presentation of the 2021 Community and Voluntary Awards in association with Laois Public Participation Network, Laois Volunteer Centre and our media partner the Leinster Express. - Laois PPN submitted the PPN Annual Report to the Department of Rural & Community Development on Friday 13th May. This is a detailed report of the key activities of Laois PPN for 2021 that will be included on the National PPN Report on the activities of all 31 PPN's which will be published by the DRCD later this year.

Pride of Place

Abbeyleix Tidy Town were winners at the IPB Pride of Place awards 2021. The awards ceremony took place on the 16th May at the INEC Killarney.

Laois Comhairle na nÓg

Laois Comhairle na nÓg continue to meet weekly. They held their Coloured fun run on Friday 13th May 2022 in Vicarstown. This event was organised by Laois Comhairle na nÓg and Youth Work Ireland Laois with over 400 people taking part in the 3km walk/run. The event was organised to create awareness around mental health.

Age Friendly Programme

The National OPC Convention took place in the Knightsbrook Hotel, Trim, Co Meath on the 11th & 12th May. It was a very informative event, covered by RTE news and attended by Minister of State for Mental Health & Older Persons Mary Butler TD. Among the speakers were Professor Rose Anne Kenny of The Irish Longitudinal Aging study on Aging, Deirdre Lang, Director of Nursing, HSE, and Aine Brady, 3rd Age Foundation. The talks were informative and insightful. The overall theme was "Live Well, Be Well" with an emphasis on aging in place, given the predicted demographics of our population. There were workshops on Age Friendly Homes, Climate Action and

Nutritional wellbeing, among other things. Sgt Graham Kavanagh of Laois/Offaly division also spoke on crime prevention on the day.

It was a very good event, which had been missed in 2020 and 2021 due to Covid-19. It was great opportunity for OPC members and Age Friendly Staff from around the country to network.

World of Work Programme 2021/22

A wrap up session took place at Portlaoise college in May to end the programme for 2021/22. The students made an excellent presentation to Laois County Council staff and the World of Work coordinator.

Community Environmental Grants 2022

Arrangements are currently underway for payments totalling €31,000 to 91 approved applicants under this grant Scheme. Applications for funding support were invited from interested bodies, groups, committees and organisations who intended to engage in environmental/amenity works during 2022. Grants were awarded to groups based on amenity works which included landscaping, development of open spaces (planting trees & shrubs, flowerbeds etc) and/or purchase of equipment to maintain/improve/clean up areas/open spaces.

CEMETERIES

Columbarium Wall

The contract has been awarded for the construction of a columbarium wall at St Peter and Pauls Cemetery Portlaoise. The works are expected to commence in Q3 of 2022.

Creating Climate Action Champions

A pilot course Creating Climate Action Champions in partnership with LOETB commenced on Wednesday 4th May. The overall objective of the course is to train up community leaders on sustainable living so that they will be I climate change champions in their own communities. There is a mutli-disciplinary team of experience tutors lined up too deliver the course over the 8 weeks including Duncan Stewart on Home Energy, Yvonne Carty from Hey Pesto! on Food Waste, Annie Apple on Fast Fashion. The development and delivery of this course has been supported by Laois County Council.

Promotion of Cycle Buses

Resources are being developed and provided under National Bike Week Funding. The Portlaoise Cycle Bus commenced on the 18th May. The Cycle Bus has been organised by members of the Town Team Sub Travel Group. The promo materials have been sponsored by Laois Bike Week via Sports & Leisure Officer and are generic so can be used by other communities. Portarlington are in recruitment phase and hope to get started before end of academic year.

Play it Again Musical Instrument Recycling Scheme

This scheme is being piloted in the Month of May in partnership with Music Generation Laois. The public can drop off broken or used musical Instruments and they are repaired and given to those who will benefit.

Portlaoise Low Carbon Town Logo

New Portlaoise Low Carbon Town Logo will be launched at the Portlaoise Low Carbon Town Implementation Group Meeting on the 27th May 2022 held in the Council Chamber, Laois County Council. The Implementation Group comprises representatives from public sector and private sector including academia, energy generation, health service, retail, transport, etc and functions as a delivery and implementation network with agreed actions showing leadership at a local level. A competition was held for the design of the logo and the winning entry will receive a prize of an electric bike also on the day.

CAT Facilitation Session

Laois County Council's Climate Action Team meets monthly to progress climate action within the operations and plans of the local authority. The Climate Action Regional Office (CARO) agreed to lead a Facilitation Session with our Climate Action Team on the 6th May 2022 which included an overview of the new Local Authority Climate Action Plans due to commence preparation in the coming months. The Management Team met with the CAT to discuss options to mainstream Climate Action across all operation of the local authority going forward.

The O'Brien Collection is a remarkable visual history of Portlaoise with invaluable textual information Rehousing will prevent deterioration and damage in the long term, while facilitating organisation, retrieval and access in the short term.

The grant awarded is €8614 with a matched funding element of 25%
