

A short summary of 2023...

Before jumping straight into 2024, this January newsletter will take a brief look back at some of the main heritage-related events and activities in Laois from last year.



APRIL: New Laois Heritage Officer Appointed

In April, Thomas Carolan was appointed as the new Heritage Officer for Laois. With a background in history and environmental management, Thomas brings a variety of experience to the role – having worked as an archaeologist, in environmental education, and most recently with LAWPRO – the Local Authority Waters Programme. "A diverse range of experience is very helpful as a Heritage Officer – from natural to built and cultural heritage, the scope of the role is broad and that's what makes it so interesting!" - Thomas



MAY: National Biodiversity Week 2023 (19th – 28th May)

Events in Laois included: a 'dusk chorus' at Abbeyleix Bog, and a photography display on the biodiversity of Abbeyleix Bog in Abbeyleix Library. Abbeyleix Library also held a Biodiversity-themed family craft event - making 'bug collage'. Wildlife photography featured again with a talk in Portlaoise library by award winning photographer Heather Rice on the techniques of capturing wildlife images, and also the benefits of nature as discussed in her book 'Nature Photography Therapy'. In Camross there was an event examining the ecology of the high-quality water of the Little Delour River.



JUNE: Re-opening of Old St. Peter's Church and Graveyard

On 13th June Thomasina Connell, then Cathaoirleach of Laois County Council officially re-opened old St. Peter's Church and Graveyard in Portlaoise. Significant work has been completed in recent years to restore the church and overall site, which had become very run down and overgrown.

Old St. Peter's Church and Graveyard are intertwined with the very origins of Portlaoise, formerly Maryborough as a town. Not long after construction began on the original fort in the town around 1547, the church and graveyard were also constructed, sitting inside the town walls that developed around the fort (named 'Fort Protector' after Edward Seymour (Lord Somerset), brother-in-law of King Henry VIII). The fort and associated buildings such as old St. Peter's Church constituted the beginning of the formalised plantation of Laois and Offaly.

The annual remembrance ceremony for those who died in World War One and in subsequent conflicts around the world was held on Sunday 19th November 2023 in Portlaoise. A service of remembrance took place in St Peter's Church of Ireland followed by a wreath laying ceremony at the War Memorial in Portlaoise where veterans and members of the public laid wreaths. Laois Heritage Seminar, and Launch of the 'Laois Heritage & Biodiversity Strategy 2021 – 2026'

On 2nd December the Laois Heritage Seminar took place in the Midlands Park Hotel in Portlaoise. With talks on recent heritage projects and activities in Laois, the event was very well attended and provided a great opportunity to share the work of the Laois heritage office with the wider community.

The event also provided the opportunity to officially launch the **Laois Heritage & Biodiversity strategy 2021 – 2026**. This strategy had been completed but but not previously published and formerly launched due to the Covid 19 pandemic.

Book Launch Celebrating 25 years of the Heritage Officer Network

Conservation Grants & Community Monuments Fund

In 2023 the Laois Heritage Office continued to support the conservation of protected structures, vernacular buildings, and archaeological monuments through the administration of grants from the Department of Housing, Local Government, and Heritage. Community groups, private individuals and the County Council recived funding towards the protection and conservation of heritage structures.

CONSERVATION GRANTS:

The Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS) supports owners and custodians to protect and care for buildings on the Laois Record of Protected Structures.

The Historic Structures Fund (HSF) focuses on the conservation and enhancement of historic structures and buildings for the benefit of communities and the public.

The Community Monuments Fund (CMF)

CMF assists with conservation, research and interpretation of archaeological monuments by communities and private owners.
