Chairman Cllr Paschal McEvoy opened the meeting.

1. Nomination of New LCDC Member

Ms. Barrett informed the meeting that she had received a letter from Mr. Peter O'Neill noting Ms A. Goodwin is temporarily resigning her position as Laois Partnership representative on the board of the LCDC. Mr. O'Neill nominated Ms. Theresa McEvoy as her temporary replacement on the board until further notice. Ms. Barrett recommended acceptance of nomination, which was proposed by Mr. P Buggy and seconded by Cllr. J King.

2. Confirmation of Minutes of LCDC meeting held on 31st July 2019

The minutes were adopted following a proposal from Mr. J Mulholland which was seconded by Cllr. J. King.

4. Correspondence

No correspondence received.

5. Community Enhancement Programme

Ms. Orla Barrett advised that the Community Enhancement Programme, which is funded by the Department of Rural and Community Development, has made available a total of €136,524 of capital grant funding to community groups in County Laois in 2019, to enhance facilities available to communities.

The subcommittee of LCDC noted that a total of 137 applications were received in total. As the project was significantly oversubscribed the subcommittee agreed that for assessment purposes the following criteria was used to assess applications:

Pass/Fail

- 1. Capital Project
- 2. Target Vulnerable Group
 - Travelers
 - Foreign Nationals
 - · People with Disabilities
 - One-Parent Families
 - Older People (65 & over)
 - · Young People
- 3. Project suitable for part funding
 - Fund one element of application.
 - Evidence of own resources to fund shortfall.
- 4. Fulfilled Procurement requirement
- 5. Limited to members only
- Applications over €10k

Points taken into consideration

- Previous funding received
- · Maintenance v capital works
- Can funding be sought elsewhere
- Community enhancement will it benefit future generations
- LECP
- Deprived areas
- Biodiversity/Environment
- Not funding Fencing/CCTV/jerseys/kits

Members of the subcommittee that had an interest in particular projects abstained from the decision in relation to the particular project. In the interest of transparency and accountability the subcommittee identified one group from each Municipal District which will be required to submit the following:

- · Minutes of last meeting
- · Evidence of bank account

The Department requests that LCDCs ring-fence 30% of its funding to grants of €1,000 or less. The remaining balance was divided as follows to facilitate 85 groups throughout the County (see appendix).

Ms. Orla Barrett advised that in additional €9,162 was also provided to support the work of Men's and Women's Sheds through the Community Enhancement Programme. 7 Men's Shed groups in Laois were notified of the grant via Laois Partnership Company. The subcommittee of LCDC noted that a total of 5 applications were received. Ms. O Barrett gave details of the subcommittee's recommendation. (See Appendix 1).

Chairman Cllr. Paschal Mc Evoy thanked the subcommittee for their work in processing the grant application forms, noting Laois LCDC received half the amount of funding than previously received in 2018.

The recommendation of the CEP subcommittee was proposed by Mr. P Buggy and seconded by Mr. J Mulholland with no amendments.

6. SICAP

Ms O Barrett informed the Committee Ms. Kim Kinsella, Internal Auditor has commenced an audit of the SICAP program as required by Pobal. Training for auditors is scheduled for 8th October 2019.

7. Healthy Ireland

Ms. C McIntyre outlined Healthy Ireland Strand 1 Round 3 funding approved in at LCDC meeting on 31st July 2019. She noted that additional funding of €32,050 for Community Mental Health Fund and €30,000 for a Small Grant Scheme had been made available since the July meeting. The Healthy Ireland Sub-Committee reviewed funding and recommended the amendments to funding proposal as per table below.
