Efforts are ongoing to contact the owners of residential properties identified as being vacant in the surveys. Where ownership cannot be established, we will continue to make local enquiries in relation to ownership, vacancy history, etc. and use the CPO process to acquire properties deemed to be suitable for social housing where all other means of returning the properties to use have been exhausted.

SERVICED SITES

Laois County Council is actively progressing the development of **serviced sites** over the coming years at a number of locations in the county. In advance of finalising its plans, Laois County Council has opened a **survey** to establish the level of interest in serviced sites among prospective home buyers in the county and, in general, their preferred locations.

In the first instance, eligibility will be determined by criteria as set out under the **Croí Conaithe** (Towns) Fund – Ready to Build Scheme (Serviced Sites for New Homes)

Scheme. Under the scheme, local authorities are supported to make serviced sites in towns and villages available to potential individual purchasers. These sites will be available at a discount on the market value of the site for the building of a property for occupation as the principal private residence of the purchaser. The level of discount to the individual will depend on the level of servicing cost incurred by the local authority before the sale of the site with discounts up to a maximum of $\epsilon_{30,000}$. The amount of such discount will be reflected in the sale price of the site to the purchaser.

Tenders for the 2023 properties and currently being evaluated and due to funding constraints, it is now proposed to commence works on the 2023 properties in the Phases below.

Phase 1

- 1) Thornberry, Abbeyleix 16 units.
- 2) Church Avenue, Stradbally 9 units.
- 3) Slieve Bloom Park, Clonaslee 8 units.

Phase 2

1) Old School Road, Ballylynan – 7 units.

Phase 3

1) St. John's Square, Portlaoise – 7 units.

LCC has also recently issued a tender for Energy Consultancy services for 2023 for a further 53 houses.

The Housing Section are currently preparing their submission for the continued programme of retrofitting homes in 2023. We have been advised that funding will be made available for up to 65% of last year's programme and we have been provisionally approved funding with an average of €36,000/unit.

The following 53 units in the following estates are being considered in 2023:

- 1) St Brigids Place, Portlaoise 26 units.
- 2) Fr O'Connor Crescent, Mountrath 11 units.
- 3) Erkindale Drive, Durrow 6 units.
- 4) Rossmore View, Graiguecullen 10 units.

(NOTE: The above estates were prioritised based on property age and MD area.)

There will be a match funding requirement to complete all the retrofitting works which will depend on the tender prices returned. Once this proposal has been approved by the Dept, we will commence surveys of properties to inform the tender for works.

HOUSING NEED

Social Housing Acquisitions

Dept of Housing Circular 17/2023 (Mitigation Measures to ease the impact of the end of winter emergency period) summarises the status of ongoing and additional mitigation measures which have or will be put in place with a view to easing the impact of the end of the eviction ban. It outlines measures that local authorities may take for any individual or household who present with a Notice to Quit and advise the Housing Officer that they are at risk of homelessness.

- 1. The local authority should follow the established process of assessment of homelessness risk for the individual/household as defined in Section 2 of the Housing Act 1988.
- 2. When this assessment has taken place and a risk established, the local authority should use prevention measures such as:
 - a. Referral to prevention service, e.g., Threshold
 - b. Assist to secure alternative accommodation through the HAP Placefinder Service
 - c. Allocate a social housing tenancy if appropriate.
- 3. If the household wishes to buy the property, the local authority will take them through the schemes available to them, e.g., the First Home Scheme (as amended) and the Local Authority Home Loan.

- 4. If the household/individual is eligible for social housing and assessed as being at risk of homelessness, the local authority can examine the acquisition of the property under an existing Tenant in Situ scheme, once all other accommodation options are exhausted.
- 5. If the household/individual is NOT eligible for social housing and all other homeless prevention options are exhausted, the local authority can consider whether it is appropriate to refer them to the new Cost Rental Tenant in Situ Scheme, being operated by the Housing Agency. This is scheme facilitates the acquisition of the house by the Housing Agency to prevent the risk of homelessness for the tenant, where they are not in receipt of any social housing supports, e.g., HAP. This scheme commenced on 1st April 2023.

To date, Laois County Council has received 60 expressions of interest for acquisition of houses that are tenanted, all in varying circumstances. Also, to date there have been 65 Notices to Quit reported to us. All NTQ's are examined on a case-by-case basis and tenants are being dealt with using all social and other housing options available.

By the end of Q1 2023, Laois County Council completed 16 acquisitions, 18 acquisitions in conveyancing currently and a further 13 properties are under consideration, totalling 45 units. 10 of these properties have tenants in situ. The above figures change with every case examined and regular cross referencing between NTQ's presented and Expressions of Interest for acquisition of properties.

HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE TO REFUGEES FLEEING CONFLICT

Laois County Council continues to lead and coordinate the Laois Ukrainian Community Response Forum. The Forum, consisting of 23 statutory and voluntary groups/agencies, meets regularly, with 15 meetings held to date, and ensures consistency and efficiency in service delivery and supports to new arrivals to our county from Ukraine. The most recent data indicates there are 922 displaced Ukrainian citizens in the County. Approximately 250 of these are in accommodation centres such as hotels, guesthouses, hostels, and refurbished properties, with the remainder in privately sourced or pledged accommodation.

The Council continues to assist the International Protection Accommodation Service (IPAS - under the auspices of Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, DCEDIY) with the temporary accommodation of Ukrainian arrivals to our county, as well as providing details nationally in relation to vacant buildings and sites suitable for medium to long term accommodation solutions. The Council continues to allocate privately pledged/offered accommodation to Ukrainian families. In excess of 40 families have been provided with accommodation through these mechanisms to date.

Site works are underway at the 42 Modular Homes project in Rathdowney. DCEDIY have indicated they expect handover of the site from OPW by mid year.

LEO Update - April 2023

- €124,146 was approved in grant aid to 5 businesses with potential to create 8 new jobs.
- One business approved for the Gradstart programme which is delivered in conjunction with Enterprise Ireland.
- 2 trading online voucher applications approved
- 85 businesses set up to avail of 1-1 mentoring.
- 4 training courses were delivered to a total of 41 participants.
- 2 additional companies signed up for the Green for Micro programme
- 1 new Laois businesses was assisted to access Micro Finance Ireland (MFI) loan funding.
- 3 student finalists from Heywood and Portlaoise College supported and assisted with preparations to go forward to represent Laois at the National Finals being held in Croke Park on Friday 5th May
- Ballykilcavan Brewing Co Ltd from Stradbally were selected as this year's winner of the Laois County Enterprise Award for 2023. They will go on to represent Local Enterprise Office Laois at the 23rd National Enterprise Awards in Dublin on the 1st June.
- Portarlington based food company O'Mimos was selected to represent Laois on the Food Academy programme. This is a food business development programme for early to mid-stage food business owners. which is run in conjunction with the Local Enterprise Office Network Bord Bia and Supervalu.

Business Support Unit (BSU) - April 2023

- The Vacant Commercial Property Incentive Scheme, in collaboration with Laois Chamber Alliance, the Portarlington Business Group and Offaly County Council, is being extended to Portarlington with a launch date in early May. A priority list of towns to extend the scheme to is being drawn up.
- Business Incentive Scheme: maps are currently being prepared to extend the scheme in to Killenard.
- Killeshin Hub Contacts were signed on Wednesday 12th April 2023 and works are to commence within 6 weeks once all commencement notices and health and safety requirements are completed.
- Abbeyleix Streetscape 45 applications were received, 28 have been approved with works commencing, 6 in progress awaiting further documentation and 11 applicants did not meet the criteria.

Public Lighting Maintenance

Public lighting Maintenance repairs are ongoing and while there are a number of outages on the network progress has been made with regard to the overall outage rate on the network having reduced from just over 1.2% to 0.79% over the last month.

J 17 National Enterprise Park Western Arm

Works are continuing on the development of the Western Arm (phase 4) with the deep services of foul & surface water network infrastructure are now installed. Excavation to road formation and road construction has also advanced. The next stage of the works will involve the installation of ESB, Telecoms, Gas & Watermain services.

1. Kyletalesha Landfill, Transfer Station & Civic Amenity Site, Portlaoise:

Normal services continue at Kyletelesha Landfill Facility and Civic Amenity Site. Landfill monitoring and aftercare maintenance is on-going. All monitoring results are being submitted to the EPA.

5. Environmental Protection

a) Protect the Water Quality Status in all Water Bodies

On site investigations of complaints in relation to water quality/water pollution are being carried out by Environmental staff.

- Investigation ongoing into wastewater discharges to the lakes at Kilminchy.
- On-going assessment of planning applications with regards to water quality protection.
- On-site investigations of complaints in relation to water pollution.

b) Air & Noise:

- All noise and air complaints are being investigated.
- On-going assessment of planning applications with regards to air and noise protection.

WATER SERVICES AND RURAL WATER

Disinfection/PH Control Programme

Civil works progressing in Meelick, Derryguile, Kyle, Five Wells, Derrymoyle and Lough WTPs. Mechanical, Electrical, Instrumentation, Control and Automation works progressed at the Strand, Knocks, Derryguile, Lough, Kyle, Five Wells, Clonin Hill, Derrymoyle, Ballyroan and Meelick Water Treatment Plant (WTP).

ESB supply upgrade currently being progressed for Five Wells. Design for Kilminchy, Fermoyle, Castle Durrow, Drim, Donaghmore, Cloghogue and Camross Water Treatment Plants currently being progressed by CWL/Uisce Eireann (UE). An automated run to waste system recently installed at the Knocks WTP to address periodic raw water turbidity issue.

Irish Water Small Towns & Villages Growth Programme

Uisce Eireann is currently considering the options and pricing report for Ballyroan. Planning and design works are ongoing for Ballinakill and Borris in Ossory.

Mountmellick and Portarlington DAP

Survey works to be progressed throughout 2023.

East and Midlands Ground Water Programme

Workshop for Portarlington Water Supply, the Swan WTP supply and the Knocks WTP supply with NOD/UE/LCC now complete.

Inlet Works Storm and Sludge Programme

Ballyroan WWTP Upgrade – Workshop 4 with UE/LCC/Conway Engineering has been completed and works are expected to progress in Q3 of 2023/Q1 of 2024.

Networks and Water Conservation

First fix, find and fix and lead replacement work is continuing in 2023.

Mains rehabilitation works currently ongoing in Portarlington and Mountrath which will provide a safer, more secure water supply by minimising the frequency of bursts and improving the resilience of the network.

National WWPS Programme

Pump Station (Bob's Bar) project is currently with Uisce Eireann at design estimation stage, awaiting conclusion of any potential environmental impacts.

WWBG PS Growth Programme (Eastern Region) Stage 2 - Borris Road PS

The estimated construction completion is Q3, 2025. Planned timeframe for WS 4 is September 2023. The Colliers Lane scope item (and other potential advanced works) may be progressed earlier and will be determined during the detail design phase.

Taking in Charge

We continue to work with UI for them to take the outstanding legacy estates in charge. 10 no. estates have been progressed and referred to the Planning Section and work is ongoing on the remaining 7 no. estates.

Work is progressing on transitioning of Moyadd Group Water Scheme to Uisce Eireann and this scheme will be taken in charge in 2023.

Multi Annual Rural Water Programme

Projects under the current programme, 2019 – 2021, are being completed. It is expected that the Department will issue details of the next Rural Water Programme in mid 2023.

Application and feasibility studies for Vicarstown and Cullohill, submitted to the Department on the 15th of September for funding under Measure, A8 (Wastewater

Collection and Treatment Needs for Villages and Settlements without access to Public Wastewater Services) are being reviewed and adjudicated upon. No response received as of yet from the Department.

Construction has commenced in Rosenallis on the Goodwin Estate Group Sewerage Scheme.

Well Grants

18 applications have been received to date in 2023 for grant aid assistance to improve private water supplies to domestic households.

The Domestic Lead Remediation Grant Scheme

The grant for the Domestic Lead Remediation Grant Scheme is no longer means tested and is available for both public and private water supplies. This grant provides 100% financial assistance (max of €5,000) to eligible applicants to replace lead piping and fittings in a house, that is occupied as the applicant's normal place of residence.

Emergency Planning, Fire Services & Flood Relief

In 2023 (to 31st March 2023) Laois County Fire & Rescue Service attended 180 emergency incidents consisting of 65 fires, 86 special service incidents & 29 false alarms.

New Fire Station in Stradbally

Following approval of Part 8 proposals in February 2022, for a new Fire Station in Stradbally, Laois County Council has recently received 'approval in principle for the construction of a new Fire Station at Stradbally.' Laois County Council has now prepared a design brief for the project with a view to the appointment of a design team to oversee the detailed design, tendering and delivery of the new Fire Station. This brief was sent to the NDFEM in December & approval to appoint the design team has now been received. The procurement process to appoint an architect led design team has now commenced.

Mountmellick Fire Station upgrade

Approval to go to tender for the upgrade has been sought from the NDFEM.

<u>Fire Service capital funding by the National Directorate for Fire & Emergency Management</u>

New Paratech trench rescue and urban search & rescue equipment (USAR) to the value of €90,000 has been received by LCFRS. Training in the use of this new equipment will be delivered by the manufacturer/supplier in early May

A second hand Mitsubishi Fuso lorry to the value of €25,000 has been delivered & will shortly go on the run as technical response rescue unit. This vehicle has an additional payload to carry the newly delivered Paratech USAR equipment.

Laois Public Participation Network (PPN)

Laois PPN hosted "A Tree for Peace", on Friday the 24th of March 2023 in the *Peoples Park* Portlaoise. This was a tree planting ceremony in support of the Ukrainian Community in Laois coinciding with National Tree Week in Ireland.



Laois PPN welcomed delegates from Longford, Kildare, Meath, Offaly and Westmeath to to Castle Durrow on Thursday, the 23rd March for the first quarterly meeting of the Midlands Region PPN in 2023.

Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP)

The Public Consultation for the 10 LECP High Level Goals concluded on Friday 14th April. All submissions will now be reviewed, and a report will be prepared, in addition to a revision of the high level goals based on the consultation.




RRDF- Borris in Ossory Courthouse

Community Grant Scheme 2023

Applications were invited from interested not for profit bodies, groups, committees and organisations (excluding sporting organisations) who intend to engage in environmental/amenity works during 2023. Closing date for receipt of applications was 3rd April 2023.

Green Hub Portarlington

Portarlington Art Collective and Portarlington Business Association SEC submitted a proposal in conjunction with Laois County Council for Green Hub Project. The project was one of 6 selected nationally and received €10k in funding from the Eastern Midlands Regional Waste Management Office.

Five artists have been partnered with a business and commissioned to make "Gragoyles" from their waste to symbolise the warding off of excessive waste. Craig Benton visited on the 30th March and conducted a number of "dumpster dives" /waste audits with participating local businesses. Reports are currently being drawn up.

A water bottle refill unit was installed on 27th March in the local park in Portarlington from LAPN funding. The showcase event whereby the Gragoyles will be unveiled is planned for the 21st April.



Healthy Laois/Age Friendly Laois


DCEDIY Capital Grant Scheme for Playgrounds




