









# Activity 3 - Colours of Nature Bingo

Print off this activity sheet and bring it with you, then search what colours you can find in your area.

Important: only colours of natural things such as plants or animals count!

- Use this sheet to tick off the colours you find.
- For older children, take count of how many of each colour you can spot. Do these numbers vary in different places (e.g. roadside in town centre, park, woodland, garden, school grounds).
- You can re-do this exercise monthly, and see how things change through the seasons.
